School fees, Attendance Dues, and Contributions

You will recently have received an updated invoice for your daughter from our Accounts Department, and I thought it would be a good time for a reminder of what your payments go towards.

On enrolment at St Dominic's you will have been aware of the costs involved in choosing St Dominic's as the school best suited to supporting your daughter's learning and faith development. We are extremely proud of our reputation as a College that provides a rich faith filled environment, achieves highly academically as well as in a wide variety of sports and extra-curricular activities. As a high performing school, we rely on the contributions from our families to help us provide the resources, facilities and equipment needed to be the great College we are. Your contributions make a real and valuable difference for what we can provide.

You will be aware of the current construction underway in the College that will result in a brand new 19classroom block, specialist teaching rooms and new pastoral area. At the completion of this first phase of our building plan next year, the second phase construction of a brand new Arts Block, for Dance, Drama, Visual Art and Music, will begin. These new buildings will completely transform our College and provide fresh, modern facilities to further enhance learning for all our students. The heart of our College will open up and increased green space will emerge.

This is an exciting time for St Doms and we are looking forward to when the buildings are completed. Our partnership with the Diocese and through the contributions made by families by way of Attendance Dues helps fund the buildings we are so looking forward to. However, as a College we are required to meet the costs of fitting out the buildings with classroom and office furniture, blinds, curtains, televisions, projectors and landscaping. The College much needed contributions and donations paid by our families will help fund these essential resources.

• Attendance Dues

Attendance Dues are a compulsory payment under the terms of the Education and Training Act 2020, and a condition of enrolment at a Catholic school.

Attendance Dues are charged for all students who attend Catholic Schools in New Zealand. It is a legal charge and not a donation; attendance dues are not tax deductible.

Attendance Dues are used to repay loans for building works done at schools in the Auckland Diocese, property related costs including school building works, buildings insurance and costs directly associated with the administration of attendance dues.

Attendance Dues are collected by the schools on behalf of the school's Proprietor and depending on the facilities available, you can pay with Cash, Eftpos, Automatic Payment and Internet Banking.

Attendance Dues can be paid in full at the beginning of the year, per term or by regular installment. As a condition of enrolment at an integrated school, there is a legal requirement for parents and caregivers to pay attendance dues.

• Special Character Contributions

The Catholic Special Character contribution is a voluntary donation of \$12.50 per term (\$50.00 per annum) per student. This contribution provides the main source of funding for all services provided to Catholic Schools in the Auckland Diocese by the Catholic Education Services Board.

No contributions are made by the Government for these services.

The Catholic Education Services Board assists schools to provide a Catholic education for your child through the preservation and enhancement of the Catholic Special Character in our schools.

General Purpose Donation

This donation is used to help pay for sporting and cultural activities, extra resources for the benefit of students including extra staffing, curriculum resources, classroom resources, library books, prizes and other purposes for the benefit of all students, including what is required to fit-out our new learning spaces.

MC4 Graduation


Congratulations to our MC4 graduates who celebrated the completion of their leadership programme last term.
