AUCKLAND TRANSPORT UPGRADE ON RATHGAR ROAD- IMPORTANT INFORMATION -DELAYSIII

Commencing Wednesday 9 May 2018 Auckland Transport (AT) will be upgrading the crossing beside the Rathgar Road entrance to St Dominic's Catholic College. AT have advised that it will take approximately three weeks to complete the upgrade at our crossing. During this period, there will be times where Rathgar Road will be down to one lane. The traffic and parking on Rathgar Road and surrounding streets are already at a premium before and after school, these upgrades are expected to increase the time delays already being experienced during these busy times.

An Auckland Council Organisation Auckland Transport (AT) and KiwiRail have begun a programme to install automatic safety swing gates to keep pedestrians safe at various stations across the Auckland region. The pedestrian crossing at Metcalf Road in Ranui was the first to get the safety swing gates last year. As part of the programme, new automatic safety gates are expected to be installed at Asquith Avenue and Rossgrove Terrace crossings (Baldwin Avenue Station), Fruitvale Road Station and the crossings at Woodward Road and Lloyd Avenue (Mount Albert Station). These gates are activated by a sensor on the tracks and have a safety zone with an emergency exit gate. These will be clearly signposted. The new gates have been designed to improve the safety of all pedestrians, especially school children who regularly cross the train tracks. Installation work is starting soon, which means students may need to allow more time in the morning to tag on/off at a different part of the platform.
