#### **MESSAGE FROM ACCOUNTS OFFICE:**

Thank you to those who have already paid the school fees in full – we really appreciate it. The school fees statements for any outstanding balances were emailed on 8/11/2018. If you are not already on a regular payment plan, please endeavour to have the fees paid in full by the end of the term, especially the Attendance Dues.

Attendance Dues are a compulsory charge for all students who attend Catholic Schools in New Zealand. They are used to repay loans for building works done at schools in the Auckland Diocese, property related costs including school building works, buildings insurance and costs directly associated with the administration of attendance dues. Attendance Dues are collected by the College on behalf of the school's Proprietor, the Roman Catholic Bishop of Auckland. The Attendance dues collected by St Dominic's College are forwarded to Auckland Common Fund Limited, a company established by the proprietors of Catholic integrated schools in the Diocese of Auckland responsible for the collection of attendance dues. If you are having difficulties paying, please contact the accounts office to discuss setting up a payment plan, or in the case of genuine hardship, applying for financial assistance.
