## MESSAGE FROM ACCOUNTS OFFICE

School fees statements have been emailed to all families – please contact the accounts office if you have not yet received yours. We encourage you to use the new payment portal which enables you to select the various items on the statement and pay on line by credit card. You will find the portal link at the bottom of the school fees statement email. Just click on the link and it will take you straight to your daughters' school fees account. We would also like to remind you that if the school fees are paid in full by 31/3/2018 there is a discount of \$100 per student.

*GENERAL PURPOSE DONATION* - We regard annual parental contributions as the fairest and most feasible way to provide educational opportunities for all our students. This view is shared by most parents at the school, regardless of their ability to pay. Payment of school donations is voluntary and we respect that. We also acknowledge that some families are not in a position to pay the donation, either in one lump sum or at all. However, we wish to provide your daughter with the best learning experience we can achieve and we rely on parental donations so that we can continue to meet and exceed your expectations about what we can deliver for all of our students. ## CO-CURRICULAR MUSIC AT ST DOMINIC'S COLLEGE

We have a wide range of different music groups that rehearse and perform at St Dominic's College. We are always looking for new members, so if you are keen to be involved please let us know! I have included a list of the different groups available and which ages/skill levels are required to take part. - String Orchestra. For anyone Year 9 and older who plays violin, viola, cello, or double bass. There may also be an opening for a pianist if they are keen to apply.
- **Concert Band**. This is for any experienced musician who plays flute, oboe, clarinet, bass clarinet, saxophone, trumpet, trombone, lower brass or drums. You will need to have learned your chosen instrument for at least two years. If you play a classical instrument that is not on the list and would still like to be involved, please contact Mrs Nelson.
- Junior Concert Band. This is for students who want to join the Concert Band in future but have only been learning their instrument for 6 months to a year.
- College Choir. Auditions are held for the College choir to check voice ranges. All students are welcome to audition whatever their
  age or singing experience.
- Flute Choir. This is for flute players who have been learning for a year or more. They are also expected to be part of either the Concert Band or Junior Band, unless there are specific extenuating circumstances which prevent this.
- Language Choirs. These will start in Term 2, as many of the student leaders are involved in Polyfest in Term 1. These choirs sing in languages other than English and are largely student lead with teacher supervision. They are open to any group of 6+ students and include any language. The only requirement is that two or more of the students in the group speak the language well enough to be able to teach lyric pronunciation to the other members of the group. If you are interested in being involved later in the year, please email Mrs Nelson with your name and the language/s you would like to be involved in singing.
