


## St Dominic's College Whānau Pānui May 2023



## Use of AI (Artificial Intelligence) in student work

As you have probably seen in the news, there is a lot of discussion about the use of AI (Artificial Intelligence) programs in schoolwork. Student schoolwork, especially assessments, **must** be their own work. Use of AI for these purposes is cheating. All NCEA assessments are reviewed through the **Turnitin** program which identifies issues of plagiarism and AI use. Where AI use is identified, we will follow our usual procedures for cheating, with work scrutinised by senior staff with the likelihood that the work will receive a "Not Achieved" grade. All students have been advised of this. It may be worthwhile discussing this with your daughter to check that she understands that presenting AI generated work as her own is not acceptable.

## Continued Negotiations - PPTA and Ministry of Education

The PPTA (Secondary Teachers Union) and the Ministry of Education continue with negotiations, and strike action has resumed. The PPTA are currently reviewing other possible strike actions, and it is important that you are aware that these are likely to continue. We will do our best to keep disruptions to student learning to a minimum and appreciate your support as we navigate this time.
