New Building – Te Whare Mātauranga

We are very excited to be entering into our much-anticipated new classroom block this year. The new 19 classroom block not only boasts a range of teaching and learning spaces but is also home to a brand new and much longed for staffroom, guidance and wellbeing centre, learning support facilities and whānau hospitality facilities. Te Whare Mātauranga (the home of wisdom/knowledge) is a striking statement piece for our college and complements our existing learning and community areas beautifully. St Dominic's has a rich history of learning and community, and the new developments reflect this.

The construction and demolition teams have been working hard to ensure it is ready to welcome our students, and the classroom spaces and workrooms are modern and beautifully designed. A crew of staff and students has been busy over the last few weeks shifting and heaving hundreds if not thousands of pieces of furniture into all the rooms, and I can honestly say – it looks stunning! You will notice that there is still some work to be done in preparation for Stage 2 – The Arts Block. I will keep you updated as expected timeline and information comes through. The building alongside the demolition site truly reflects the growth and change happening within the College. It really is very exciting.

Uniform

Government ban on student phones in schools

You may be aware of the Governments intention to ban all use of mobile phones by students in schools. We currently have our own processes and protocols in place to limit phone use during the school day. We will be reviewing our policy this term to ensure we follow all legal requirements. In the meantime, can you please ensure that you support our current system of student phone use by:

- Contacting the office if you need to unexpectedly collect your daughter during the school day.
- Refrain from calling your daughter during the school day.
- Reminding your daughter about the need to follow all current school rules on phone use at school

Your daughter will be reminded that:

- Phones are to be kept in their pocket or their bag during the school day
- Phones are only used in class when instructed by a member of staff (E.G. to take educational photos, recording etc)
- If she feels unwell she needs to go to the office where a member of staff will contact her parent/guardian if needed
